## APPLICATION OF INTENT TO APPLY TO THE 4+1 PROGRAM IN SPECIAL EDUCATION AT THE UNIVERSITY OF MAINE

NOTICE: This form is an internal departmental application to be considered for admission to an accelerated Four Plus One (4+1) option at the University of Maine. This does not serve as application or acceptance into the M.Ed. program.

## This form must be submitted to the Special Education program and NOT to the Graduate School.

- Students must apply to the 4+1 track prior to completing their undergraduate degree or Teacher Certification postbaccalaureate.
- Students are required to take 12 credits (4 courses) of 400-level coursework in the area of Special Education during their undergraduate degree or Teacher Certification post-baccalaureate program, to be counted toward the 4+1.
- The credits will be transferred to the student's graduate record upon formal admission to the Graduate School and successful completion of the 4+1 curriculum.
- Students will officially apply to the M.Ed. in Special Education with the Graduate School application the semester prior to completing their undergraduate degree or Teacher Certification post-baccalaureate program.
- After completing the undergraduate or post-baccalaureate teacher certification program, students must apply to the Maine Department of Education for initial certification
- Students are required to be working or volunteering with students with disabilities prior to being accepted to the M.Ed. program.
- Once accepted, students may complete the M.Ed. at the University of Maine in one year.
